Leona Brausen (Nancy Kimble/Costume Designer)

Acclaimed as both an actor and a costume designer, Leona has worked steadily in Edmonton and across Canada for the past two decades. She's an Associate Artist and founding member of Teatro la Quindicina, and has made innumerable appearances in the plays of Stewart Lemoine, most memorably in Cocktails at Pam's, The Vile Governess and Other Psychodramas, Damp Fury, On the Banks of the Nut, The Margin of the Sky, and Skirts on Fire. She's been seen on stages from Vancouver to Montreal, with particularly memorable Toronto appearances in La Bête at Canadian Stage and Teatro's The Glittering Heart at Factory Theatre. Her costume work has been seen at Edmonton's theatres both large and small and she was the winner of Edmonton's 2000/01 Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Award for her designs for Teatro's The Hothouse Prince. At the 2003 Edmonton Fringe, Leona appeared in The Tunnels of Little Chicago. a play she co-wrote with Trevor Anderson and Briana Buckmaster. She's also a core company member of Die-Nasty, the live improvised soap opera which runs weekly at Edmonton's Varscona Theatre. She'll be seen at this summer's New York International Fringe in Pith!

Jeff Haslam (Jack Vail)

Jeff has been working professionally as an actor in Edmonton since 1986 and has also been seen in numerous other major Canadian centres from Vancouver to Toronto. His last Winnipeg appearance was with Teatro's What Gives?/All Ears in 1989. Jeff is an Artistic Associate with Teatro la Ouindicina, and his recent credits with the company include Cocktails at Pam's, Pith!, On the Banks of the Nut Eros and the Itchy Ant, The Exquisite Hour, Vidalia, The Margin of the Sky, and Skirts on Fire. He is also the author of two plays recently produced by Teatro, Citizen Plate and Poki Talks. Among his other recent acting credits in Edmonton were Luther Billis in South Pacific, the title role in Floyd Collins, Orin the Dentist in Little Shop of Horrors, and Felix Ungar in The Odd Couple. Jeff is a four time recipient of Edmonton's Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Award for acting. He is also in demand for his voice-over and narration work in radio, television, and film. He's a founder and core company member of the live improvised soap opera Die-Nasty, now in it's thirteenth season. He looks forward to appearing with Pith! at the New York International Fringe festival this August.

Davina Stewart (Virginia Tilford)

An Artistic Associate of Teatro La Quindicina, she made her debut with the company in 1986 as The Vile Governess, a role she reprised in February 2004. Her other recent Teatro credits include Biting the Butterhorn. Vidalia, On the Banks of the Nut, Cocktails at Pam's, Damp Fury, Skirts on Fire, and Evelyn Strange. She also appeared with Teatro in Toronto in The Vile Governess. The Glittering Heart, and Shockers Delight. A two-time Sterling Award winner, Davina appeared at the 2003 Edmonton Fringe in All's Well that Ends Well and The Trojan Women. Among her other favourite roles have been Hedda in Hedda Gabler, Agnes in Dancing at Lughnasa, and Cecily Pigeon in The Odd Couple. Davina played a recurring role in the Edmonton-produced television series Mentors, and she was also in the television movie One Hundred Davs in the Jungle. She's a core company member of the improvised soap opera Die-Nasty. She looks forward to reprising the role of Virginia this August at the New York International Fringe Festival.

Stewart Lemoine (Writer/Director)

For the past two decades Stewart has been Artistic Director of Edmonton's Teatro La Quindicina, a company devoted to creating new work for a resident company of actors. He's a four-time winner of the Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Award for Outstanding New Play, and he's also won Toronto's Dora Mayor Moore Award for his play The Vile Governess and Other Psychodramas. He has written over fifty works for the stage, including twenty premieres at the Edmonton Fringe Festival, which he helped inaugurate in 1982. Among his more notable successes have been Cocktails at Pam's, Pith!, Evelyn Strange, The Exquisite Hour, Shockers Delight!, and The Margin of the Sky. He and Teatro have visited the Winnipeg Fringe on two previous occasions, with What Gives? and All Ears in 1989 and Caribbean Muskrat in 2003. Stewart has also collaborated with Edmonton singer/actress Sheri Somerville on numerous cabaret shows and a recent concert with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra. He's actively involved in running The Varscona Theatre, one of Edmonton's busiest theatre venues, where he's the producer of the long running improvised soap opera Die-Nasty and the Eurostyle variety show Oh Susanna. In 2003 his contributions to the arts in Alberta earned him a Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal, presented by Lieutenant Governor Lois Hole.

Briana Buckmaster (Executive Producer)

Briana is performing a multiplicity of functions for the Pith! tour, but her true vocation is as an actress. She made her professional stage debut with Teatro in On the Banks of the Nut in 2001 and subsequently returned in Poki Talks, Vidalia, Caribbean Muskrat (seen at last year's Winnipeg Fringe), and The Vile Governess and Other Psychodramas. She's appeared at Edmonton's Citadel Theatre as Rizzo in *Grease*, and appeared with Panties Productions in Paradise City. At the 2003 Edmonton Fringe she appeared in The Tunnels of Little Chicago, a play she co-wrote with Trevor Anderson and Leona Brausen. For the past two seasons, she's been appearing regularly at The Varscona on the variety show Oh Susanna and the improvised soap opera Die-Nasty.

Ian Rowe (Stage Manager/ Publicist)

Ian's previous Teatro credits include performing in Fatty Goes Wild and stage managing Vidalia. He has appeared frequently on-stage at The Varscona, as a regular in Rapid Fire Theatre's Theatresports and *Chimprov* and in the improvised soap opera Die-Nasty. He wrote and performed in the play Kimota, seen at the 2002 Edmonton and Winnipeg Fringe festivals and he also appeared in *Hump* with Panties Productions. Ian has been particularly active in film and video of late. With the Draft Six, he co-produced and appeared in *The Sonic Brooms* and Turnbuckle and the latter, which he also edited has recently been contracted for worldwide DVD distribution. Most recently, he edited When the Pig Looks at the Matchbox produced by Blue Sky Communications. Ian is also the founder of Edmonton's VOTE! society, which encourages 18-30 year-olds to vote.

Pith! takes place in Providence, Rhode Island in 1931.

The play is performed without intermission. The running time is 85 minutes.

ROSA PONSELLE

Madame Ponselle was born in Connecticut in 1897 to Italian immigrant parents. After several years spent appearing in Vaudeville, she was discovered by talent scouts from New York's Metropolitan Opera and made her debut there in 1918, singing opposite Enrico Caruso in Verdi's La Forza del Destino at the age of only 21. Performing almost exclusively at The Met, she was heard regularly in leading Italian and French operatic roles until her premature and somewhat mysterious retirement in 1937. It is unfortunate that the primitive recording techniques of the 20's and 30's could not do her full justice, for all who heard her in person attested that hers was the most astonishingly beautiful voice of the twentieth century. She died in 1981.
